This week's illustration: Paul Writing Timothy a Letter

· Are you seeing repentance in yourself? Are you seeing repentance in your children? Are you seeing repentance in your grandchildren? Why not?

· Have you taught and instilled inside your family the message of 'grace = repentance' or the message of 'hyper-grace'?

· Why do you think that many non-Christians do not want to hear the message of the modern gospel or hyper-grace?

· Is there relationship within hyper-grace? Answer: No

· What happens when God's people (the church) no longer recognize the real gospel of Christ which is repentance to the grace of God, within their own Bibles? Answer: Professing Christians begin turning real repentant Christians into the authorities.

· From the evidence we have submitted thus far we can conclude:

1.) The real Bible has already become hated in the United States of America.

2.) The people sitting within churches are being groomed by the social system.

3.) The product of the church body is made up of people who have been publicly educated

4.) The message that the public system is bringing into the church is the message of hyper-grace/ tolerance through the ideology of socialism.

· What are some examples of actions another professing 'Christian' (or not) may turn your family into the authorities for?

A. Women dressing like women, in dresses.

B. A meek and mild temperament in a woman.

C. A humble spirit not willing or wanting to gossip.

D. A woman who stays home or a 'keeper of the home'

E. A woman who chooses to wear a head covering, not just a head band, but more than 2 extra inches of fabric on the back of the head.

F. Parents being active in their parental roles: such as not allowing young children access to smart devices, restricting internet access to impressionable children, monitoring their child's media access to prevent exposure to damaging (evil) content, and/or not allowing their child to become homosexual.

· How can you spot an unrepentant people or church?

Answer: Look for the fruits of Spirit in a person's life. The true Fruits of the Spirit will always have roots in repentance. If it does not have roots of repentance the fruits that the people or church is trying to produce will look forced and fake. As

for a church ask question that will reveal the fruits of repentance or the lack of repentance such as: "Does your church celebrate Halloween" etc.

· Did God call Paul to stay in his sin? Answer: No

Review:

· In 1 & 2 Cor. Paul was speaking in the voice of a parent correcting the people of Corinth.

· In conclusion Paul said that he would be harsh with the people of Corinth if they did not repent of their sins. He told the people to test themselves to see if they were in the faith. What was that faith? Answer: Grace is = Repentance of Heart.

· Look at Paul's actions: Q- Is it okay to defend yourself? Did Paul defend himself? Yes. Q- Was Paul sarcastic? Yes. Q- Is it okay to correct your children? Yes! Please do.

· In last weeks lesson, Paul encourages the people of Corinth towards reconciliation and peace. Was that reconciliation made without repentance? No. That peace with God and each other was made through the message of repentance which is by the Grace of God.

· Summation: Paul's message was "do as I do". In today's lesson ask yourself, "What were Paul's actions and can I act and react the same way?" The answer is, yes.

1 Timothy Chapter 1 Q&A

· Who are the two characters of today's lesson? The apostle Paul & Timothy. Paul is writing a letter to Timothy who he feels is like his son in Messiah's family.

· Where does this story take place?

Answer: Ephesus

· Why was this letter written?

Answer: So that the people of Ephesus would not turn to myths, social twisting of truth, and indoctrinations of the old Jewish civil law (arguing over the Torah).

· What was the goal of this communication?

Answer: Love from a pure heart, a clean conscience, and genuine faith.

· Was the Torah good or to be used and how?

Answer: The Torah was a reminder of what sin is. It was used for the lawless, the rebellious, ungodly, sinful, unholy, worldly, etc. people.

· Why was Paul shown mercy?

Answer: Vs. 13, Because Paul was ignorant that his actions were an offense to God. After God opened Paul's understanding and Paul changed his ways, he was then accountable to God for his actions.

· How does Paul refer to Timothy?

Answer: Vs. 18 "My son."

Chapter 2 Q&A

· How are we to live?

Answer: Vs. 2 Peaceful, quiet life, in godliness & with respect.

· How many gods are there?

Answer: Vs. 5, There is only one God.

· What was Jesus?

Answer: Vs. 6, Ransom for ALL

Notation: Vs. 7, (I am telling the truth. I am not lying)

· How are women to dress?

Answer: Vs. 9, Modestly, no seductive hair styles or excess gold, pearls and costly apparel. Notation Vs. 10, Apparel that suits women claiming to be Godly and have good deeds.

· Should a woman teach a man?

Answer: Vs. 12 No. This verse is directed to the church of Messiah, not the worldly and ungodly. Read this in context. This verse assumes that the man is a repentant man, an honest man, that he does not use profanity or is into sexual sins such as pornography or homosexuality (or other sins) as stated in this text.

· What was the promise for a woman?

Answer: That she would be sustained in childbirth if she was to be faithful, loving, acting in holiness and sound judgement.

2 Timothy Chapter 1 Q&A

· Who are the characters of this book?

Answer: Paul who is writing to Timothy.

· How did Paul feel about Timothy?

Answer: That Timothy was like his child. Paul felt as a father towards Timothy.

· What did Paul remember about Timothy?

Answer: Paul remembered Timothy's tears when Timothy was first converted to the faith. He remembered Timothy's pure heart. Pay attention and notice this Godly sorrow of repentance.

· What did Paul call himself?

Answer: Vs. 8 A prisoner.

· Why was Paul suffering?

Answer: Vs. 11 For the good news of Jesus.

· Who had turned away from Paul?

Answer: Vs. 15 Everyone

· Who was not ashamed of Paul's imprisonment?

Answer: Onesiphorus

· Who did Paul say also served Messiah's community in Ephesus?

Answer: Onesiphorus

2 Timothy Chapter 2 Q&A

· If anyone competes as an athlete, is he crowned with an award if he cheats?

Answer: Vs. 5 No. The same would be assumed of heaven.

· According to Paul who should receive the first fruits of (their own) crops?

Answer: Vs. 6 The hard-working farmer. Or/ the owner.

(Let's stop and reference this last verse.) Please turn to Deuteronomy 14:22- End -
Read

· Who suffered hardships as a criminal?

Answer: Paul

· Why?

Answer: So that the people might obtain the salvation that is in Messiah with glory. If we died with Christ (repentance) we will also live with Christ. If we endure to the end we will also reign with Christ in Heaven.

· If we deny Christ, what will he do?

Answer: 12 & 13 He will deny us.

· According to these verses and all we have read in this study of repentance so far, is the phrase "Once saved always saved" a true statement?

Answer: No

· What are we to speak?

Answer: Truth

· By Paul's actions, is it okay to call people out by name for twisting the truth and distorting the gospel?

Answer: Vs. 16-19 Please read... The answer is, yes.

· How can we become a vessel of honor in the sight of God?

Answer: Vs. 21 "If anyone of us cleans ourselves, then, we become a vessel of honor prepared for every good work.

Every good 'what'?

Answer: Good work

· What are we supposed to pursue?

Answer: Vs. 22 We are to pursue righteousness.

2 Timothy Chapter 3 Q&A

· Are we supposed to stay away from people who are 'lovers of self' (Humanistic Worldview)?

Answer: Vs. 5 Yes. Paul says, "Avoid these people!".

· How can you spot a real member of Messiah's community?

Answer: Vs. 12 All will be persecuted.

Chapter 4

· Will we be judged?

Answer: Vs. 1 Yes

· Who will be the judge and who will He judge?

Answer: Jesus will judge, and he will judge both the living and the dead.

· Will the majority of the people remain steadfast to the message of repentance?

Answer: Vs. 3 No. Read. For the time will come...

· What did Paul ask Timothy to bring?

Answer: Vs. 13 Paul's cloak, scrolls and parchments.

· Who did harm to Paul? Is it okay to say and vocalize that someone has done you harm, and also point out that person by name?

Answer: Vs. 14 "Alexander the coppersmith" Yes. It is okay to tell someone that you have been harmed and who the person who harmed you was/is.

· Will some people be repaid for their harm that they have caused upon you and your family? Is it okay to say and vocalize that someone will receive their due payment for the harm they have caused you, in the natural end of their days, according to their deeds against you?

Answer: Vs. 14 Yes, God will repay them according to their deeds. Yes, it is biblical to voice this fact, for it is truth.

· Should we be on guard against these harmful people or should we allow them back into our lives to continue manipulating?

Answer: Yes, we should be on guard against these people. Also, No. We should not allow these people back into our lives.

· Who stood by Paul at his first defense?

Answer; No one.

· Why?

Answer: Vs. 17 So that the message of the gospel, which is repentance, could be proclaimed into all nations and so that all men might hear it.

· Was Paul rescued?

Answer: Vs. 17 Yes! & Amen!
