Hebrews 11

Vs 1

Q.) What is faith?

A.) The Substance of things that you hope for and the evidence of things you cannot see.

Vs 3

Q.) What was created by faith?

A.) The Universe

Vs. 4

Q.) How did Abel use faith?

A.) He offered God a better sacrifice than Cain.

Vs. 5

Q.) How did Enoch use faith?

A.) He was noted by God for pleasing God with his faith. So, God took Enoch. Enoch did not die. God took him.

Vs. 6

Q.) Can you please God without faith?

A.) No

Vs. 7

Q.) How did Noah use faith?

A.) When warned about things that have not happened yet, he prepared and built an ark for safety. He condemned the world, and God counted it to Noah as righteousness.

Vs. 8

Q.) How did Abraham use faith?

A.) He went out to a place that he was unfamiliar with to get an inheritance. He did not know where he was going. He migrated to a new land of promise. He lived in a tent. And, he believed God.

Vs. 11

Q.) How did Sarah use faith?

A.) She received the ability to conceive a child when she was past the age to have a baby. She believed the one who had made the promise to her. That promise was made to Sarah by God.

Vs. 13

Q.) Who were all these people (The Cloud of Witnesses) who believed the One who made the promise?

A.) They were strangers and sojourners or travelers on Earth.

Vs. 15

Q.) What were all these people seeking?

A.) A homeland that they had come from that they can return to, Heaven.

Vs. 16

Statement: People deeply want a homeland that is heaven. Talk about the song Petra "We are strangers".

Q.) What has God prepared for these people?

A.) A City

Vs. 20

Q.) How did Issac use faith?

A.) He blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things in the future.

Vs. 21

Q.) How did Jacob use faith?

A.) He blessed each of the sons of Joseph.

Vs. 22

Q.) How did Joseph use faith?

A.) When he was about to die, he talked about the Exodus of Bnei Israel (the children of Israel) and gave instructions about his bones.

Vs. 23

Q.) How did Moses' Mother use faith?

A.) At the time of Moses' birth his parents hid him for 3 months. They were not afraid of the King.

Vs. 24

Q.) How did Moses use faith?

A.) When Moses grew up, he refused to be called the Son of Pharaoh's daughter. He chose to suffer mistreatment instead of enjoying the passing pleasures of sin. He left Egypt. He did not fear the King. He looked forward to heaven. He persevered. He imagined the One Who is Invisible. He kept the Passover (the smearing of the blood). He passed through the Red Sea. Notation: The Hebrew Bible puts the translation and location on the Sea of Reeds.

Vs. 30

Q.) How did Joshua use faith?

A.) By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they were encircled for seven days.

Vs. 31

Q.) How did Rahab use faith?

A.) She welcomed the spies with peace.

Vs. 32

Q.) How many more people who lived by faith are there?

A.) Innumerable- Examples: Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel and the prophets.

Vs. 35

Q.) What were some of their rewards on Earth?

A.) Torture, trials of mocking, Scourging, chains in prison, stoned, sawed in half, murdered, clothed in skins of animals, wandered and lived in caves and in holes in the ground.

Q.) How did all these people (the cloud of witnesses) reach their reward in Heaven?

A.) They reached their reward in heaven by living by faith!

Hebrews 12

Vs. 1

Q.) What are we surrounded by?

A.) A Great Cloud of Witnesses

Q.) What should we get rid of?

A.) Sin that entangles us.

Q.) What should we be doing?

A.) Running the race that has been set before us with endurance.

Vs. 2

Q.) What should we be thinking about?

A.) We should be focusing on Jesus!

Q.) What did Jesus focus on?

A.) The cross

Q.) Where is Jesus Now?

A.) At the right hand of God.

Vs. 3

Q.) What should we consider?

A.) The hostility that Jesus suffered at the hand of sinners.

Q.) Why?

A.) So that we do not grow tired while running this race.

Vs. 4

Q.) How does Paul compare us and our race to Jesus?

A.) We (in our race) have not endured bloodshed.

Vs. 5

Q.) How does God love us?

A.) He disciplines us.

Q.) What does Paul say that God considers each person who believes in Him by faith?

A.) Sons- children, daughters whom he accepts.

Vs. 7

Q.) Why is God disciplining you and me?

A.) So that we may endure to the end of our race.

Vs. 9

Q.) What does Paul, the author of Hebrews, compare God's love towards us as?

A.) The love of a human father.

Q.) If we are subject to the Father of all Spirits what shall happen to us?

A.) We shall live!

Vs 10

Q.) Why are we disciplined by God?

A.) For our benefit, so that we may share his holiness.

Vs. 11

Q.) What does discipline yield or produce?

A.) The peaceful fruit of righteousness.

Vs. 14

Q.) What are we supposed to pursue?

A.) Peace with everyone, holiness without which no one will see the Lord.

Vs. 15

Q.) What does the phrase, "See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God" mean?

A.) That no one falls into sin and falls out of God's grace.

Vs. 16-17

Q.) What happens to the immoral or the godless person?

A.) "He found no repentance even though he begged for it while he was crying."

Vs. 18-24

Q.) What is God compared to?

A.) In this passage God is compared to a burning mountain. Under the Old Law in the days of Moses, he says "I am quaking with fear", in other words, a fearful mountain.

Under the New Law that is under Jesus you have come to the City of Mt. Zion the City of the Living God, the heavenly Jerusalem with angels and a joyous gathering, an assembly of the first born who are written in the scrolls of heaven. You have come to Yeshua the mediator of a New and relational Covenant. You have entered a new and living family.

Vs. 25

Q.) Should we refuse this message?

A.) No. We should not reject the one who warns us from heaven.

Q.) Why?

A.) Because now God will not only shake the Earth as in Moses day, but He will now shake the heavens.

Vs. 27

Q.) What does this illustration show us?

A.) This illustration shows us that the removal of "things that can be shaken" is sin, and the things that cannot be shaken are holiness and righteousness.

Vs. 28

Q.) What are the saints of God referred to?

A.) A kingdom that cannot be shaken.

Q.) What does God desire from us?

A.) Worship in a manner that God wants in reverence and awe his way, not ours.

Vs. 29

Q.) What is God?

A.) A consuming fire. This is a statement for both the old law under Moses and new law within Jesus.

Chapter 13

Vs. 1 & 2

Q.) What should we allow to continue?

A.) Brotherly (Christian) love and hospitality to strangers.

Q.) What is possible when we show hospitality to strangers?

A.) Some have entertained angels unaware.

Vs. 4

Q.) Will God judge the sexually immoral?

A.) Yes

Vs. 5

Q.) How does God feel about the love of money?

A.) Paul warns us to keep our lifestyles free from the love of money and to be content with what we have.

Q.) Will God leave us?

A.) No

Vs. 6

Q.) What is God?

A.) Our Helper

Vs. 7

Q.) Should we imitate our Christian Godly leaders?

A.) Yes

Vs. 14

Q.) Do we have a home on Earth?

A.) No

Q.) Where is our home?

A.) Heaven

Vs. 15

Q.) What is to be our sacrifice to God now?

A.) Praise, doing good and sharing with other believers.

Vs. 17

Q.) What leaders is he talking about in verse 17?

A.) Godly Christian leaders.

Vs. 18

Q.) How should we conduct ourselves?

A.) Honorably

Vs. 23

Q.) What happened to Timothy?

A.) He was put in prison.
